



william james interface referral service

- o Mental health and wellness referral help line available Monday, Wednesday Friday, 9 am-5 pm, Tuesday and Thursday 8am-6pm at 888-244-6843 (toll free).
- This is a free, confidential referral service for individuals across the lifespan living in participating communities (Westford is a participating community). Callers will work with a Resource and Referral Counselor who will help them navigate the challenges of finding mental health services. Each caller will be assigned a lead counselor who will provide matches to services, as well as provide information and resources about mental health and wellness. https://interface.williamiames.edu/
- o This service is paid by the Town of Westford through ARPA funds for the 2023 calendar year.

westford mobile clinician

- o The goal of this service is to reduce the wait time for counseling services for Westford residents.
- o Services are provided free of charge. Health insurance will not be charged for the service. Services are paid through ARPA funds.
- O Up to 8 sessions will be offered. The clinician will determine the number and frequency of sessions following the initial appointment. Determining factors may include nature of the mental health issue; length of time estimated for private therapy to begin; and/ the client's response to therapy. Specifics are discussed at the intake screening visit.
- o Services are offered in person at a town building or virtually
- O Each individual and situation is unique, so careful consideration is given when determining if the Westford Mobile Clinician is right for residents. Due to scope of service and ACA ethical guidelines there may be situations where this service is not suitable for all residents and employees. If it is determined the Mobile Clinician is not a fit, we will work with the resident on alternative services.
- o This service is paid by the Town of Westford through ARPA funds

community behavioral and mental health committee

- o CBMHC will take a community-wide approach by engaging partners, providers, faith leaders and residents. The Committee will focus on mental health services and access, suicide and substance use disorder prevention and interventions.
 - Review the Westford mental and behavioral health data, provided by the Community Wellness and Health Departments. The group will review existing mental and behavioral resources, programming, and services for all residents.
 - Advise the Select Board, Board of Health and other town departments to improve awareness and recommend programs, resources, and tools focusing both on prevention and interventions, including specific items with budgetary estimates and suggested timelines for implementation.
 - Advocate for substance use disorder and mental health services which promote prevention, treatment, and recovery for all diverse populations.
